

Regulations of The Clare Golf Club 2017



REGULATION 1: Membership & Competitions

Membership Categories:	2017/18
• Full member: Full playing rights (12 months) full voting rights	\$675
• Winter member: Full playing rights from 1 st April to 30 th September no voting rights	\$360
• Summer member: Full playing rights from 1 st October to 31 st March no voting rights	\$380
• Senior Member (over 65) Full paying rights (12 months) full voting rights	\$590
• Restricted member (previously novice membership) and Country Member (residing 50km from Clare Golf Club) Full playing rights (12 months) no voting rights	\$380
• Junior Member: under 18 years of age as at the 1 st April of the year of application no voting rights	\$60
• Social Membership: No competition playing rights except events not recorded in Golf Link for Handicap (e.g. twilight) , no voting rights.	\$380
• Corporate Membership:	TBA

Membership fees to be increased each year by CPI % (Adelaide) as a minimum as at previous EOFY (to the next \$5), except for junior membership which will remain at \$60 until further notice.

All memberships to be applied on a pro rata basis except junior membership which will be applied as \$60 for any part of the current season

Members with restricted membership who feel they may qualify for an extension to this membership are to apply to the committee prior to the end of March each year.

All applications for restricted membership are to be assessed by the committee on their individual merit for acceptance at the reduced rate.

Membership can be paid in installments (fee applicable of \$5 per month for playing memberships) upon application to the Finance Committee.

Application for membership

All persons wishing to become members of the Clare Golf Club will complete and sign an Application for Membership Form and this is to be authorised by the Management Committee upon payment of the appropriate fee at the committees next scheduled meeting.

All previous members whose membership has lapsed for a period of time beyond the terms of the renewal invoice issued (30 days) are required to reapply for membership.

Competitions

Regulations governing competitions are to be determined by the Captains and the Events &/or Match Committee(s) and any major alterations are to be ratified by the Management Committee.

Tee times to be set by the Captains.

Hole-in-One Recognition

A "hole-in-one" is recognized on the honor boards when it is achieved in any paid Clare Golf Club Inc. competition by a person holding an official golf handicap, however sponsors prizes for a "hole-in-one" are for specific competitions only.

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REGULATION 2: Dress Code

The Clare Golf Club Facilitates and provides for the enjoyment of all members, guests and visitors are requested to present themselves in a neat, clean and tidy manner of dress, which at no time will provoke complaints, be offensive or embarrass other members.

“Neat appropriate golf attire to be worn for all competition play, e.g. No Cycling lycra, no swimwear, no gymwear. If Clarification required please approach the relevant match committee.”

Headwear is discouraged in the clubhouse.

Suitable footwear must be worn at all times both on course and within the clubhouse, players are requested not to wear footwear in the upstairs facility which has been used on the golf course.

REGULATION 4: Motorised Transport for Playing Golf

Refer Cart hire agreement for cart responsibilities.

Carts are available to be used in all competitions.

Use of motorized carts will be prohibited when course conditions are deemed too wet

Motorised Transport allowed on the Clare Golf Course

A – Purpose Built Golf Carts

B – ATV/Motorbike Transport (As long as cart agreement is signed re liability)

C – Scooters (weather dependent)

Greenkeeper to determine when motorised transport types are or are not permitted for use on the course
Greenkeeper to advise all captains and pro-shop staff. Greenkeepers decision is final

Motorised Cart Hire Fees for members:

Members are able to hire motorized carts at a reduced rate of \$5 less on all Sat, Sun and Public Holidays and \$10 for all other weekdays.

Guests of members receive a reduction of \$5 on green fees on an 18 hole round. This is limited to 3 guests per member and once per calendar month

Members Motorised Cart Use Approval

All members wishing to receive approval to use their own carts or qualify for member's rates on club carts must read & understand the terms of use and complete a hire/use agreement application, which is valid for the entirety of their membership.

REGULATION 5 : Extreme Weather and Heat Regulations.

Weather Policy for Heat:

For Competitions:

If temperature is forecast to be over 38 degrees tee times to be set at earliest possible times and no play to commence after 1:00pm

Green Fee players: It is recommended that if temperature is forecast to be over 38 degrees tee times to be set at earliest possible times

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All Players, Caddies, Officials & Spectators to note

Hydration

High levels of dehydration may increase the risk of heat related illness. Thirst alone should not be relied upon as an indicator of fluid needs. Fluid requirements for optimal hydration differ between individuals; therefore it is essential that players monitor specific fluid losses during training and competition. During a round of golf, each person should drink cooled fluid at regular intervals to replace fluid lost through sweating. Fluids taken should be cooler than ambient (air) temperature. Aside from on-course water supplies, each individual should take a water bottle containing a minimum of 1000ml of cooled fluids onto the course.

Clothing

Within the dress requirement guidelines of the Clare Golf Club Inc. it is recommended that all players, caddies and officials wear light coloured, loose fitting clothes of natural fibers or composite fabrics with high wicking (absorption) properties that provide for adequate ventilation. This clothing should further complement the existing practices in Australia that protect the skin against permanent damage from the sun.

Hats and Sunscreen

It is recommended all players, caddies and officials wear hats to assist in the prevention of heat illness. Ideally, hats should be wide brimmed and well vented.

Sunscreen with a minimum SPF (Sun Protection Factor) rating of 30+ is suggested to be used by all players, caddies, spectators and officials. In addition, it is recommended that all players, caddies, spectators and officials carry 30+ sunscreen with them during a round for periodic re-application a minimum of every two hours.

Resting in Shaded Areas

Wherever possible, during a round of golf in hot weather conditions, all players, caddies, spectators and officials should rest in naturally shaded areas when not actively playing strokes. In addition, players, caddies, spectators and officials are encouraged to utilize other artificial means of shade such as umbrellas and on-course structures during a round of golf in hot conditions. Use of motorized carts on catastrophic weather days is not allowed.

Weather Policy for Thunderstorms/Lightning/Flooding Events

Play may be suspended and the golf course closed during a storm event, play will be recommenced once the captain or Golf club professional deems the conditions to be safe for play to resume. Captains, Event & Match Committees will determine competition status at the end of the storm or during the storm.
